Year Group Round Up



Buttercups

This half term the Buttercups have been learning about fairy tales. We have had great fun making and baking gingerbread men, Gruffalo crumble and trying porridge like goldilocks ate with different toppings too! We have been learning about Chinese New Year and we made a Chinese drum and a lantern.

We have started to learn phonics and we are doing really well.

Reception

The Owls and Robins have been learning all about minibeasts and have enjoyed bug hunting around the classroom. We have used the Superworm story in our English work to write sentences about the characters, make list of insects we could see throughout the story and label parts of various minibeasts. In Maths the children have learnt about mass and capacity and have used their maths language to describe the volume of water in their bottles (Full, empty, half full, half empty, nearly full, nearly empty). We have also been looking closely at numbers 5,6,7,8, particularly the composition of 5. Owls and Robins are becoming more confident to explain how they can make the number 5 with different numbers. During Art Owls and Robins have explored patterns and made repeating patterns with different resources. Lastly in Geography/ Understanding of the World learning we have talked about weather and seasonal changes and have been looking out for the signs of spring.



Year 1

Year 1 have had a very busy Spring 1 term. We have loved learning about the different countries and capital cities of the UK. We have enjoyed developing our knowledge of human and physical geographical features and had lots of fun spotting different features during our walk around Burton Latimer. In Science we

have focused on staying healthy and different types of exercise. In DT we designed our own fruit salad and are excited to make it very soon! In Art, we have studied the famous artist Giuseppe Arcimboldo and created our very own fruit faces using collage techniques and printing. We are looking forward to continuing our 'Roots, Shoots and Muddy Boots' topic next term and enhancing our learning with a trip to Sacrewell Farm in March!

Year 2 alf of Spring term Year 2 h

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The first half of Spring term Year 2 have been learning about the world in Geography, including continents and oceans with a focus on Antarctica. We have learnt about expeditions to the South Pole by Captain Scott and more recently Preet Chandi. We were amazed by how they were able to survive in such cold temperatures. In Maths we have begun multiplication and division which now means we can play TT rockstars! Who will

be the first to earn a certificate? In English we have innovated the story of Lost and Found and recently wrote poems about colours and seasons. We created spreadsheets in computing and most excitingly designed and made our own soups in Design Technology. This included preparing the vegetables before cooking.

Year 3

Year 3 have had a creative term looking at sculpting clay and making their own coil pots. We have also written their own Greek myths and created a Biography of a Greek God/Goddess. In maths pupils have been looking at measure and how to calculate the perimeter of a shape.



Year 4

Year 4 have thoroughly enjoyed having ukelele lessons with Mr Dicken from NMPAT. Learning an entirely new skill has been challenging and has tested our coordination and resilience but we are looking forward to sharing our new found talent with you at a later date. Heron class have also been swimming and all adults involved with this have commented on their excellent behaviour and attitudes. As a result, the progress has been fantastic to see, with all pupils gaining in confidence and showing real enthusiasm. We hope they get to further practise these skills outside of school too. It's Osprey's turn now! Our topic of mountains and weather has led to us rehearsing knowledge and learning lots of new information. We can talk all about different mountains, using technical language and applying that knowledge to make decisions such as which mountain we would rather climb. We have been equally busy tackling multiplication and division in Maths and writing diaries and disaster stories in English. Definitely a busy but enjoyable term.

Year 5

This term Year 5 pupils succeeded in their learning and made good progress. They worked hard solving fraction problems and learnt short division. In Religion and Worldview lessons pupils enjoyed learning about Islam and what Muslims believe.




Year 6
