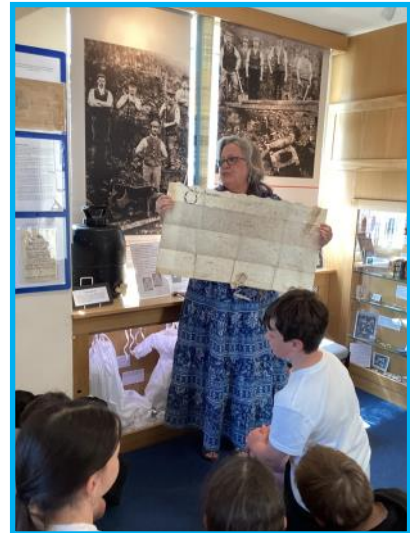

Year 1

This linked to our Science topic where we have been busy learning about different animal types and their diets. We enjoyed a visit to the local church where we found out about different parts of a church and participated in different activities. Year 2

We have been very busy in year 2 this term. In English, we have used the story Gorilla by Anthony Browne to support our writing. We have written a class innovation and also written our own versions using the wishing story plot pattern. We have learnt to use commas in a list and speech marks and tried really hard to include these skills in our writing. In maths, we have been learning about fractions, we have learnt to identify halves, quarters and thirds. We are now moving on to time so if you can please practise over half term. In science, we have been learning about plants and have completed investigations to see what plants need to stay healthy and alive.





Year 3

This term, the children have been working really hard. We have begun to learn about the Stone Age and are looking forward to learning more about the Bronze Age and Iron Age next half term. We have loved making pulleys in D&T this term. We designed and tested them (to varying degrees of success). We have thoroughly enjoyed our class novel this term which is called Anisha - Accidental Detective. We are really looking forward to starting our next novel - Fantastic Mr Fox by Roald Dahl. The children have been working hard on their fractions this term, some of the concepts are a little challenging however we have been impressed with the resilience the children have shown. Last half term, we can do it!



Year 4

Year 4 have had a fun filled term. In Maths, we have covered a range of skills including decimals, time and money. We are proud of how hard Year 4 have worked on their times tables. The children have written some fantastic suspense stories which definitely scared their teachers and then finished the term with our 5 sentence stories. We explored outdoor learning during History and enjoyed eating our edible Roman roads. In PE we have thoroughly enjoyed Cricket and Athletics. Year 5

This half term Year 5 pupils have been focusing on William Shakespeare and writing playscripts. We have had a few drama activities to support their writing. In Science we have started a new unit on Forces and are beginning to learn about different forces. In History our topic is Tudors and we are beginning to learn about the Tudor dynasty. Everyone is excited about exploring and learning these new topics.

I think it's safe to say that year 6 have had a VERY busy term! Every pupil has worked incredibly hard in the lead up to SATs week and we are so proud of each and every one of them.
