Buttercup Nursery Summer Term 2

For our WOW day this term, we will become Buttercup explorers and go on an outing to hunt for some dinosaurs. We cannot wait for our adventure to begin on the 21st June.

This term the Buttercups will become explorers hunting for dinosaurs and deep sea divers searching for sea creatures.

In maths Buttercups will be focusing on number recognition, counting 1-20, 2d shapes and focusing on maths language more and fewer.

Buttercup Nursery follows the read write inc phonics scheme. Children that are going to school will begin to learn how to blend words to read sentences. Other phonic activities that will be taking place will include listening walks for environmental sounds and sound discrimination games. All of these activities will encourage and enhance listening and speaking skills.

In the community the Buttercups will have a weekly rhyme time session at the library and continue to visit the parks in Burton Latimer.

Nursery staff will continue to observe children using tapestry and add to their learning journeys, we would be grateful if you can continue this at home.

The Buttercups will continue to cook on a regular basis to build upon their cooking skills.

We will finish our topics with a WOW day to visit some dinosaurs.

Early Years Foundation Stage - Prime Areas

Personal, Social and Emotional development

This term we will continue to focus on following the nursery rules and talk about keeping safe. We will also be developing our friendships within nursery and support each other with turn taking. We will also be talking to the children about what makes a good friend.

Physical development

This term we will continue with our 'go noodle', dough disco and funky fingers sessions. We will also be practising our kinetic poses and strengthening our bodies to become strong writers. The children will learn about personal hygiene and why it is important. PE sessions will continue twice a week with children practising how to dress themselves.

Communication and Language

This term children will continue to listen to stories and build up their vocabulary based on their own experiences. The children will have the opportunity to express this language in their role play with their peers.
